



A Gyoseishoshi can provide support to foreign nationals residing in Japan when applying for residence status, work qualifications, business start-ups, or naturalization.

The NIC offers free over-the-counter guidance on these types of matters to help foreigners who may be having difficulty with certain procedures or paperwork or simply need a few queries cleared up. Official matters can pose a challenge even in one's native tongue at times, so it can particularly be difficult at times in a country such as Japan, where usual western conventions are replaced with their local equivalents. ## Jököji Temple Autumn Leaf Festival

Jōkōji is a Rinzai school Zen Buddhist temple connected to the Owari Tokugawa clan. Both the mausoleum of Owari Tokugawa clan ancestor Yoshinao and the late-Muromachi period (1336 - 1573) main hall (also known as the Mui-den) are designated National Important Cultural Assets, and the spectacle of the autumn leaves spreading throughout the grounds is not to be missed. The surrounding area includes Jōkōji Park (centered around Shoden'ike Pond with its six-sided pavillion) and Jokoji Natural Recreation Forest, with walking paths through the forest and numerous spots where you can

enjoy nature and feel the area's history.

Christian art forms the basis of Western painting. Its history extends to the foundation of Christianity, and by the third century tales from the Bible were already being depicted, along with the image of Christ. Even after this time, Christian motifs became an important subject of painting, and great artists painted religious works under the patronage of the church and nobility, spreading the teachings of the Christian faith to the people.

This exhibition presents works from the substantial collections of the Okazaki Mindscape Museum and the Mie Prefectural Art Museum, focusing on Baroque paintings of the 17th century, when religious painting flourished with the Catholic Reformation movement, from the fine Renaissance piece 'Christ Supported by Angels' to the art of 20th century religious painter Georges Rouault. #### The Aesthetics of Lines: Works from the Collection of the Aichi Prefectural Museum of Art 愛知県美術館 コレクション企画「線の美学」

Since ancient times, human beings have carved and drawn lines on objects, and given them various meanings. In the development of the history of Western art, line and the elements of drawing have been repeatedly discussed as indicators of the characteristics of a given period or artist. By the 20th century, there was a strong awareness of line as a basic figurative element, and line came to take a prominent role in artworks with the growth of abstract art. In the East, the line of the brush had long been explored as the most important element of the visual arts, and calligraphy as art flourished. Linear elements can be seen not only in the realm of figurative art, but also in the structure of music, and in movement in performance art. This exhibition examines the varied roles and meaning of line in human expression, through works held in the Museum's collection.



#### ●'My Number' Social Security / Tax Number System 社会保障・税番号(マイナンバー)制度

#### • What is 'My Number'?

A 12-digit number which will be issued to every individual with a Resident Register (住民票 / Jūminhyo). Even foreign nationals, provided they have a Resident Register, will be allocated a 'My Number'

#### Purpose

To increase efficiency and transparency of the social security and taxation systems, and bring about the realization of a more convenient, fair and equal society for all residents.

Types of government operations to which the 'My Number' will apply

The system will be introduced in three areas, namely social security, taxation, and disaster countermeasures.

#### Schedule

A notification card (通知力一ド/ tsūchi-kādo) with your number will be sent to the address at which you are registered by registered mail between mid-October and late November, 2015. Use of the 'My Number' system will begin in January, 2016. Individual number cards (個人番号力一ド / kojin-bango-kādo) will be issued upon request from this time

#### Important

Please keep the notification card in a safe place, and do not disclose your number to anyone except for government- and employment-related procedures.

Are you separating your garbage and recyclables correctly? Let's have a quick refresher on how to separate recyclables from other waste

Plastic bags (e.g. for snacks) and packs (e.g. for convenience store *bentō* lunchboxes) are classified as plastic containers and packaging (プラスチック製容器包装). Paper boxes and bags are classified as paper containers and packaging (新製容器包装)

Are any of these plastic or paper items mixed in with your burnable waste? If disposed of as burnable waste, these items will be incinerated, not recycled.

Recyclable plastic and paper containers and packaging, as well as plastic bottles, are marked with symbols (see right) which specify the material type. By checking these symbols, you will be able to correctly separate your recyclables.

Garbage and recyclables should be placed into the designated garbage bags and put out for collection by 8:00 on the designated day (7:00 for Naka Ward).


